As this newsletter is being written our teenagers are attending a summer camp in the neighboring Province along with teenagers from three other Dioceses'. Ban Mae Marie can accommodate 24 teenagers, at present we have 15 with 2 more expected to arrive after the Thai New Year—"Songhran".





Teenagers at Ban Mae Marie are fortunate indeed to have a special home and the opportunity of good care and the possibility to complete their education in local schools and technical schools.

Mother of Perpetual Help Center in Nong Bua Lamphu Thailand assists children who have been born as HIV/AIDS patients. They also help other children of HIV/AIDS and other poor families of neighboring villages with school supplies and food supplements.

Villa Marie Hospice --

Over the years many changes have come about at Villa Marie; before the Anti Retroviral medications became available to all suffering with Aids, many who came to the hospice for care would die—now patients seldom have to die. The social stigma still remains! Counseling and education as well as compassionate friendship are our efforts to bring about a change into their lives. So many now who come for care have been rejected by family and friends and have no home to return to; thus, we have recently converted several of the buildings on our farm into decent living conditions where some of those atients who will remain with us indefinitely have a place where they can call "home". Here they can look after themselves with some supervision from the Center. Here they have the opportunity to plant gardens, look after the fish ponds and fruit trees also as a source of food. Others who require more care will remain at the hospice.





Aids Education and Awareness --


Our Aids Education and Awareness program continues in schools throughout the Province of Nong Bua Lamphu, but with a new twist starting this year. Thanks to Misean Cara in Ireland we have received a grant which enables a new beginning for the training of teachers in these schools to eventually enable them to give counseling and our "Aids Education and Awareness Program to their own students in each of their schools. In March we conducted the first 3 day camp with teachers from 10 different schools and nurses from local subhealth centers who are also interested in our program. This camp is being followed up with another 3 day workshop before they will be able to assist staff from the Center for actual prac-

tical experience at other schools. These teachers have shown enthusiasm with this training and we are confident that the program will continue until teachers in all Districts within the Province will be able to carry on with the training exercise in
