



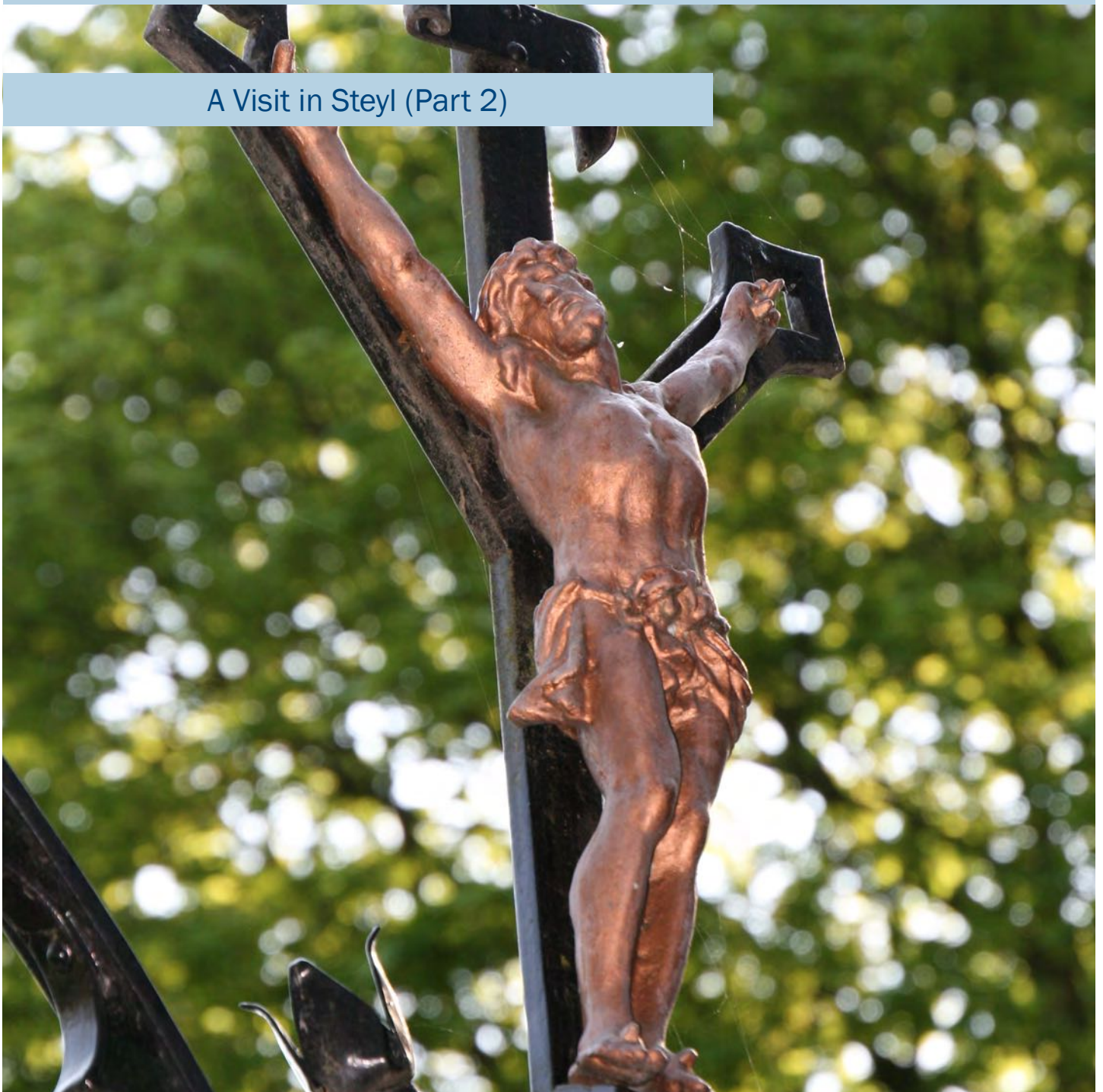

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## Editorial

### Rolling Stones!

“Who will roll away the stone for us?” That was a big worry. They had resigned themselves to what had happened. And now they were wanting to do the final rituals. Perhaps, a final goodbye. But then, who would roll the stone away? This was one aspect they did not plan out. It was an insurmountable hurdle, laid over the entrance to Jesus' tomb. On their way, they talked about what had happened – the arrest, torture, and death of the person they loved. They had followed Jesus to Jerusalem. Everything seemed good then. He was healing the sick and bringing joy to the thousands. He was their Messiah! Sadly, the story changed. Jesus was killed! The one in whom they had placed all their hope was now lying in a tomb behind a heavy stone – dead.

When they reached the tomb at daybreak, they were taken aback by the unexpected. They found the stone rolled away. The tomb was empty. Something eerie had happened. Perplexed and frightened, they entered the tomb. The man dressed in a white robe told them, “Do not be alarmed; you are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has been raised; he is not here” (Mark 16:6). The stone was rolled away! And that's how the Easter story begins.

Easter becomes personal and our own when we realize that our stories too resemble the original Easter story of the stone being rolled away. I am grateful I have my own Easter story that happened at the death of my mother. Her death left a huge void in me. As she was lying on the hospital bed, struggling for life, I wanted her to stay. She was otherwise a healthy woman who bravely confronted her challenges, especially after my dad's death. This time, however, I watched her give up. I wanted her to stay because she was everything to me. I wasn't ready for what was about to happen. It was as if the earth was closing in. The stone was rolling in. And then somehow, I found the strength to let go, to surrender. The resurrection of Jesus slowly brought in hope and a new way of understanding reality. The stone covering my fears and uncertainties was being rolled away. As the days passed by, it was my faith in the resurrection that created a comforting presence of my mother in my life. A presence that gave me new strength. I am grateful that my faith journey took me to a place of deep gratitude. That's my Easter story.

Christ is risen. May all of us experience the risen Lord. Happy Easter!

## A Visit to Steyl

### Part 2: St. Gregor

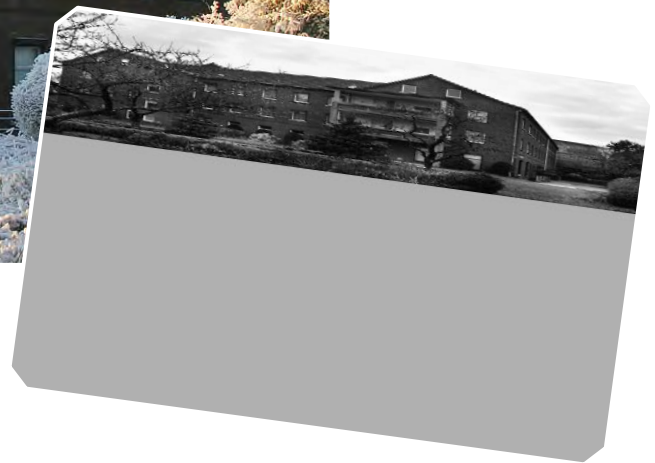
After visiting the Missionhouse St. Michael in the last issue the tour through Steyl will continue with a visit to St. Gregor and its garden.

To get an idea of the whole area on the Meuse, here is an aerial view from Google Earth.





St Gregor had different functions over the years. In 1890 Arnold Janssen acquired the building from German Augustinian nuns who had lived there since 1876 and returned to their original convent in Essen. It was the convent of the Missionary Sisters until 1904 and from 1896 also of the Cloistered Sisters. After their move in 1904, St Gregor became the home of the brothers and the rear part of the building was the SVD's infirmary and retirement home.



St. Arnold Janssen also lived there from 1905 until his death in 1909.

St. Gregor was also the seat of the Generalate at the beginning of the 20th century.

Since the seniors moved to St. Wendel in 2008, the building has been unused.

The chapel of St. Gregor with the three altars, the altar of Mary, the main altar and the altar of St. Joseph (from left to right). St. Arnold Janssen suffered a stroke in front of the altar of Mary.



On the ground floor of St. Gregor with a view of the garden is the room in which Arnold Janssen lived from 1905 until his death in 1909. In the hallway next to the door, There is a marble slab with the Latin inscription *B. Arnoldus Janssen ab anno 1905 hic habitavit et die 15. m. Jan. 1909 defunctus est.* (B. Arnold Janssen lived here since 1905 and died on 15 Jan. 1909).

Janssen 15 Jan. 1909). Arnold Janssen's personal belongings were on display there until the beginning of 2022. They are now in St Michael's in the corridor to the oratory.

A special piece of furniture in the room is the space-saving table. With the lid closed, it is a large desk; with the lid open, it is a bed.

Above the bed is a marble slab with the inscription *Hic obiit Dno Pater et Fundator noster Arnoldus Janssen Die 15 Jan. 1909* (Here died in the Lord our father and founder Arnold



The garden of St. Gregor is a quiet place with lawns and old trees. In the past, two large arbours offered the sick and elderly a nice place to rest. Unfortunately, they no longer exist.

At the end of the garden, a life-size statue of Mary and Child was erected in 1950 to mark the 75th anniversary of the SVD. It stands under a canopy with marble columns. The statue is framed by taxus trees.



At the far end of the garden, hidden behind trees, is the Resurrection Chapel from 1913. From the entrance on the left is a niche with a depiction of the Resurrection framed by five coloured windows. On the wall to the right of the entrance are the names of the confreres who died in the war.



A ceramic Via Crucis dating from 1920 can be found on the outer wall of the garden.

#### Friends of SVD – Blessing and Commissioning of the Arnold Jansen Spirituality Centre

The newly built Arnold Jansen Spirituality Centre (AJSC) is a residential facility with offices, a Chapel, and self-contained 48 bedrooms. The Apostolic Nuncio to Ghana, Most Rev. Henryk Jagodzinski blessed the building and was commissioned by the Provincial Superior, Fr. Cyprian Kuupol, SVD on 15<sup>th</sup> January 2022, during the feast day celebration of St. Arnold Janssen.

Present at the ceremony were Most Rev. John Bonaventure Kwofie, CSSp the Metropolitan Archbishop of Accra, Most Rev. Emmanuel Fianu, SVD, Bishop of Ho Diocese, Most Rev. Gabriel Edoe Kumordji, SVD, Bishop of Keta-Akatsi diocese, as well as SVD confreres, SSpS sisters, and SVD lay partners.

The program began with a Mass. During Mass, the jubilarians both SVD and SSpS were blessed as well as presented with gifts, a usual practice during the Arnoldus family feast.

After Mass, Fr. Andrews Obeng, SVD, the Director of the Centre, narrated the story of how AJSC was made possible because of immense support from individuals from within and outside the Province. He thanked all benefactors including donors from SVDs working abroad and local lay faithful who in diverse ways helped with the construction of the magnificent edifice. There

were goodwill speeches by the Metropolitan Archbishop of Accra, SSpS and SVD lay partners.

The Center offers a serene and eco-friendly environment. Some of the services offered at the Center include spiritual direction, retreat, training programs, workshops, counseling, clinical psychology, and psychotherapy. The Center is also open for pastoral care.

The program ended with refreshments for all invited guests.

#### Soverdia Nagekeo – Care for the Environment



#### The Implementation of the Encyclical *Laudato Si*

The implementation of the Encyclical *Laudato Si*, and to show its concern for the environment, the Soverdia IDE of the Nagekeo district, carried out the following activities.

#### Planting Palm Trees in the Mbay City Area

The carrying out of tree planting action was accomplished during this rainy season. Mbay is a very hot area that requires cooling. This is possible through forest conservation by planting trees. We are, therefore, inviting people to plant trees to keep our environment cool.

Children displayed their talents through singing and dance performances. Gifts were distributed to the children followed by a sumptuous meal.

On 9<sup>th</sup> January, Fr. Cyril Edward, SVD led a Spiritual Recollection for the members at the Divine Word Seminary, Pune. He spoke about Arnoldus Trinitarian and Missions (ATM) spirituality in a creative way.

### The Lay Society of St. Arnold Janssen (LSSAJ) – Activities of the Last Months and Elections



1<sup>st</sup> March 2022, nearly two years after the pandemic shuttered the Philippines, the country now saw a more relaxed quarantine restriction. However, the Russia-Ukraine conflict, will definitely impact the lives of people around the globe. Coupled with these situations, our country faces National Elections on 9<sup>th</sup> May 2022. In the midst of the current situations, the LSSAJ continues to pursue its advocacies.

In collaboration with the XVD Association and the Philippine Rosary Movement (PRM), we continue with night rosary prayers via zoom and live streaming on Facebook. Prayer intention is now more focused on world peace, particularly the Russian-Ukraine conflict. The LSSAJ chapter in Dasmarañas city continues with FTL (Faith Transforming Life) sessions and Biblical apostolate.

Super typhoon Rai, locally known as Odette, wreaked havoc in the Visayas and Mindanao Islands, affecting several SVD parishes, schools and our fellow SVD lay partners. LSSAJ provided spiritual, financial, and material support.

On 29<sup>th</sup> January, LSSAJ in collaboration with the Federation of Filipino Married Priests sponsored a forum “The State of the Philippine Environment and Possible Ways Forward”. More than a hundred participated from various sectors and some LSSAJ members including architect Jun Palafox and Samuel Yap. Architect Jun Palafox avidly pursues LSSAJ’s advocacy by holding regular podcasts on environmental protection and urban planning through YouTube.



On 26<sup>th</sup> February, LSSAJ together with the Federation of Filipino Married Priests conducted a forum “At the Crossroads of Metaphysics and History”, with Fr. Raymond Festin, SVD, General Councilor, as the main speaker. It was an interesting discussion for Filipinos and Christians. The forum was part of LSSAJ’s electoral education in pursuit of promoting social justice and good governance. Charlie Avila, and Cecil Floresca were the reactors.

LSSAJ continues addressing the issues confronting the elderly, particularly poverty, elderly abuse, and exclusion. Daisy Leones is a regular speaker on its weekly webinar. She discusses issues like universal social pension, financial literacy, elderly abuse, care for the elderly, etc.

### Lay Mission Partners of the Divine Word (LaMP-DW) - A Lot of Activities



#### Planning for Congregational Direction

On 16<sup>th</sup> October 2021, members of the LaMP-DW – Bohol Chapter convened at the covered court of Holy Name University, Tagbilaran City, Bohol to set directions for the organization. The Chapter President, Ms. Nanelyn Wate welcomed all the participants to this first-ever planning activity.

The first session started with input by Fr. Eduardo Rocha, SVD, followed by the visioning session with goals and activities. The group decided to focus on Family and Youth, Social Justice and Poverty Eradication and Integrity of Creation. These activities intend to strengthen and spread the mission of the SVD through its lay partners. The workshop was ably facilitated by Atty. Adolfo Doroy and Dr. Maria Paz Espiritu, members of LaMP.

#### Marian Pilgrimages at Bohol's Holy Doors

We had our first Marian pilgrimage on 8<sup>th</sup> October. We visited six churches with Marian patrons in the Diocese of Tagbilaran. On 30<sup>th</sup> October, members visited the oldest churches in Philippine history; the Church of Immaculada Concepcion, Baclayon, the newly restored Our Lady of Guadalupe Church, Loboc, and Our Lady of Fatima Shrine, Carmen, Bohol where Holy Mass was celebrated by Fr. Charlton Plateros, SVD and Fr. Vic Uy, SVD.

#### Outreach Program

On 23<sup>rd</sup> December LaMP-DW held its outreach activity with garbage segregators at Basic Education Department Gym of Holy Name University. The activity was opened by a prayer by Fr. Charlton, SVD, and was followed by *Kumustahan* or greeting the garbage collectors. A short input, sharing, and distribution of the gifts followed. ## Laicos Verbo Divino (LVD) – Synodal Consultation in Zamora: From the Local to the Universal



In our Pastoral Action Unit of *Morales del Vino* formed by seven towns, we have been in Synod mode since October 2021. This Synodal consultation called by Pope Francis, (closed here on March 4) has a three-fold theme “For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, and Mission. Two of our parishioners have traveled to several towns in recent weeks to respond in the community to a questionnaire that has guided us in our reflection, to dialogue on the changes that the Church needs in these areas and to contribute constructive suggestions that will help us to continue walking together as the People of God going forth.

The proposals are local but seek an ambitious and far-reaching objective: more involvement in social situations of poverty and marginalization, pastoral accompaniment; in the face of the problem of loneliness of the elderly due to the growing depopulation in the villages; the lack of religious vocations;

and the role of the laity as co-responsible in the mission and parish ministry. More proposals were tabled: for leisure and volunteering to bring young people closer, more commitment that makes us go out of our comfort zone both as pastors and parishioners, formation for pastoral agents, and even the old debate about married priests in view of the scarce presence of priests due to the vocation crisis, to achieve a Missionary Church. These were just some of the proposals, which will be integrated into a document to contribute to the Diocese of Zamora.

It is the moment that Pope Francis offers to the People of God to listen to his “voice”: May God enlighten us to make the Church grow in fidelity to the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Everyone especially enjoyed the get-together with the SVD community on Saturday evening. A repetition at the SVD-Partner meeting in the fall is definitely desired!



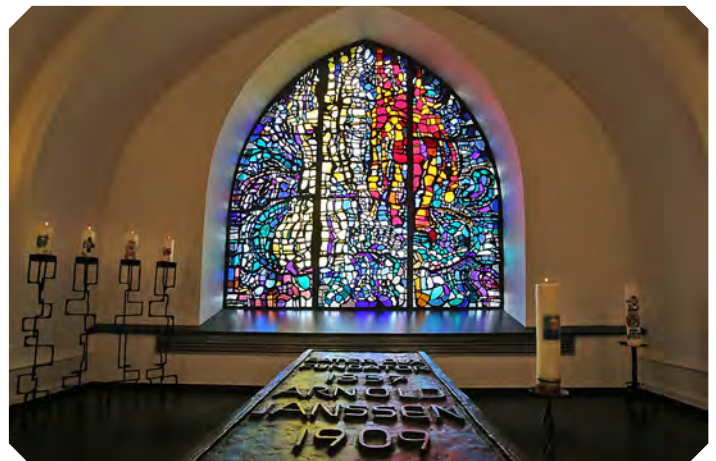
#### Prayer for peace in Ukraine

Missionaries aren't always born with exceptional gifts or outstanding talents. It is the simple and everyday people like you and me who let God guide their steps completely.

It's my pleasure to introduce to you our missionary couple, Rubiela Ramírez de Rodríguez and Rogelio Rodríguez-Pizza, SVD lay partners from *Misioneros Laicos del Verbo Divino (MLVD)*, Panama (CAM).

#### Demonstration of Selfless Love

Rubiela and Rogelio are married for 35 years and are blessed with three biological children; Luana, Pedro, and Clareana, and four foster children; Erika, Emilena, Melissa, and Janeth. They believe that being foster parents is a blessing. God calls all of us to care for children who need homes and they have helped their foster children feel safe, valued, and welcomed into the family. Here's a glimpse into the life and mission of our missionary couple.

Rogelio speaks -

"Every month, as a family, we participate in the different activities of the MLVD group. We have been doing this before and during the pandemic in the Parish of St. Jerome and in its different communities, especially at the Chapel of St. Arnold Janssen, the first of God's future parishes. We participate in the Holy Mass as a family and our faith in God and in His ways grows stronger every day."

#### Evangelization and Reaching Out

"Most of the time we do missions together and believe that it is truly a great gift from God. We have founded various prayer groups of the Holy Rosary and Lectio Divina to encourage people to take part in the Sunday Mass. With the collaboration of parish communities, we have dedicated ourselves to recycling items and collecting dry food for needy families. We have teamed up as guides to the immigration process with priests from various countries. We have helped people as

family catechists with pre-marriage sessions. My wife, Rubi conducts pre-baptismal and confirmation classes and organizes confirmation catechesis to the youth."

Rubi shares -

"We have lived in Panama City. Erika was 16 years when she came to us to finish her studies. Along with her studies, we also sent her for Bible classes in our Parish. Today, along with her elder daughter, she is a catechist and is a part of the parish choir."

I have been active in pastoral activities since 1997 and my husband since 2009. Our experience as missionaries is wonderful because we have had the opportunity to share with people from different cultures, not only in our Parish but also in the missions. We are delegates of the Word and catechists working alongside the SVDs. We like to form prayer groups in the places where we go. Along with the Word of God, we distribute images of the Virgin Mary and Jesus. We teach people how to make the Holy Rosary until they are able to do so on their own, and continue to spread the message. We work together in areas such as social work, medicine, dry food distribution, clothing, school supplies, and so on.

We are also active in the SVD congregation in the community of *Isla Otoque* and in the community of *Isla Otoque Occidente\** as delegates and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. Here, we help the community as catechists.

We feel happy by doing all these pastoral works, to the greater glory of God. We do it in thanksgiving to God for the many blessings received. May God and Virgin Mary continue to bless us all."

I met Rogelio and Rubi in October 2017 at the 1<sup>st</sup> International Workshop for SVD Lay Partners in Nemi, Rome. *How long do you know the SVD and how did you get to know them?*

For many years I have lived in a small parish in the Czech Republic, which in 2011 became a Parish administered by the SVD. There were a number of events in the parish related to this change. I had three small children at the time and not everything was in my power. However, I was thrilled when the parish priest, began to rebuild the parish on our knees - by Adoration, Rosary, and of

### Let's introduce saints of our country to each other!

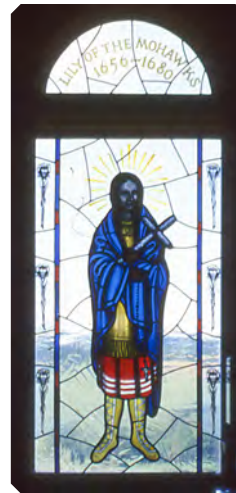

## News from the SVD

### Episcopal Ordination – Bishop Tim Norton, SVD

22 February 2022 at the Cathedral of St Stephen, the Brisbane Archdiocese and the Divine Word Missionaries celebrated the appointment of Fr. Tim Norton, SVD as the Auxiliary Bishop of Brisbane.

Bishop Tim was closely associated with the SVD lay partners, especially during their First International Workshop (2017) and during the SVD 18<sup>th</sup> General Chapter (2018) in Nemi, Rome.

We congratulate him and wish him joy and satisfaction in his new ministry.



### Arnold Janssen Spirituality Network (AJSN)



During the opening of the 15<sup>th</sup> General Chapter of the Missionary Sisters of the Holy Spirit (SSpS) last January, Fr. Budi Kleden, SVD mentioned that in 2017 just before the SVD 18<sup>th</sup> general Chapter confreres reacted with surprise upon learning the decision of the two General Council to suspend the Arnold Janssen Spirituality Team in

Steyl. Fr. Budi describes the reaction as “an indication of the importance our members put on the collaboration of our two congregations in the area of spirituality.”

Given the importance the members of the Arnoldus family put on the collaborative work on the Spirituality of our Founder and the Founding Generation. Therefore after a period of consultation and restructuring process, grateful to all who have been part of the previous AJSC teams the SSpS/SSpSAP/SVD joint General Councils announce last May 23, 2021 the new structure for spiritual animation in our family. The new structure which is based on the principles of decentralization, participation, collaboration and contextualization was given an updated name “Arnold Janssen Spirituality Network” (AJSN). And it is composed of three levels: first the Congregational level with the International Core Team (ICT), Extended Team and Advisory Group, second is the Continental/Zonal level and third Province/Region/Mission/National level.

The International Core Team is given the shared responsibility for 15<sup>th</sup> and oversight of all AJSN activities. The members appointed to the team are Fr. Peter Dusicka, SVD from Slovakia, Sr. Teresa Sriwahyuni, SSpS from Indonesia, Sr. Maria Cristiana Avalos, SSpS from Argentina and Fr. Dennis Manzana, SVD from the Philippines.

The objectives envisioned for the new structure are: First, to promote and animate Arnold Janssen Spirituality and our Congregations’ rich Spiritual heritage among members of the Arnoldus Family, lay partners, and others. Second, to foster the

contextualization of this spirituality into today’s reality. Thirdly, to form and train spiritual animators. Fourth is to reflect research and prepare materials, publication of articles. And fifth, to promote the ongoing interchange of information/ideas between other related disciplines or dimensions within the Arnoldus family.

Due to difficulty of air travel during the COVID pandemic and with two of the members of the ICT were working outside Europe at the time of their new appointment, the team was only able to meet in person last November. Now that the team has started its mission, one of the immediate tasks is the establishment of the AJSN Extended Team by connecting with and empowering persons who already coordinate/represent spiritual animation at the Zonal/Continental level.

We look forward to a dynamic network of collaboration. As we hope that the involvement of the lay partners in spiritual animation will continue to grow and by deepening the legacy of our Founder our collaboration may be strengthened. Together we pray that the Holy Triune God may be a constant source of inspiration for us as we serve, collaborate and create a network for spiritual animation.

## Culinary Trip Around the World

### Coffee (*Kaffeetrinken*) from Germany - Mole cake

After a break in the last issue we will continue now our culinary trip around the world. EUROPE will share a typical central- and north European meal: Coffee (*"Kaffeetrinken"*) from Germany.

Drinking coffee (*"Kaffeetrinken"*) is not just having a coffee, it is another meal on Sundays and holidays. Traditionally, lunch is eaten at 12 noon, coffee at 3 pm and dinner between 6 and 7 pm. But people also arrange to meet for coffee in a café. Cafés are only open from early noon to dinnertime and offer only small snacks at lunchtime, in addition to a large selection of cakes and tarts.

#### Ingredients:

##### Dough

- 125 g butter
- 125 g sugar
- 4 egg whites
- 50 g flour
- 10 g cocoa
- 4 level tsp baking powder
- 4 egg yolks
- 75 g ground hazelnut kernels
- 100 g dark chocolate chips
- 1 sachet vanilla sugar

##### Filling

- 2 bananas
- 1 jar of sour cherries (drained weight 350 g)
- 2 tablespoons lemon juice
- 600 ml cream
- 25 g sugar
- 1 packet ground gelatine



#### How to make it:

##### For the dough

1. Beat the egg whites until stiff and a knife edge remains visible.
2. Beat the soft butter until smooth, add the sugar and vanilla sugar, stirring until a thick mixture is formed.
3. Gradually stir in the egg yolks.
4. Mix flour with cocoa powder, baking powder, hazelnut kernels and grated chocolate and stir into the butter/egg mixture in two portions.
5. Carefully stir in the whipped egg whites.
6. Pour the batter into a 26 cm cake tin and smooth it down.
7. Bake in a preheated oven (180° C) for 30 minutes.
8. After the cake has cooled, mark a 1-2 cm border on it with a knife.
9. Scoop out the centre to a depth of 1 cm with a tablespoon.
10. Crumble the pastry pieces in a bowl.

##### For the filling

1. Drain the cherries well.
2. Peel the bananas, cut in half lengthwise, sprinkle with lemon juice and place on top of the hollowed out cake.
3. Spread the cherries between/over the bananas.
4. Whip the cream with the sugar until stiff.
5. Prepare the gelatine according to the instructions on the packet and fold into the cream.
6. Spread the cream like a dome on the fruit and sprinkle with the breadcrumbs (press down lightly if necessary).

Chill the cake for at least 1 hour.

Enjoy your cake at *Kaffeetrinken*!
