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## Editorial

### Listening ...

As I reflect on themes of Synodality and of the 19<sup>th</sup> SVD General Chapter 2024, my favorite passage in the Bible comes to my mind. It is an incredible story to listen to and ponder anytime. The Emmaus Story!

Let's walk this story again. Two disappointed disciples are walking back home to Emmaus from Jerusalem. They are disillusioned because their hope was crucified and buried in a tomb. They are now planning to move on with their lives trying to make sense of the sad events of the last few days. A stranger joins them in their journey; he simply asks a question and then listens. They talk to him expressing their hopes and expectations of a man called Jesus who was later crucified. Jesus then enters into a conversation with them, eventually leading them to extend a dinner invitation to him.

Being able to voice our concerns, and being heard, has a huge impact on how we relate to one another. Any meaningful relationship is built on the simple sincere process of talking and listening. The global synodal process is all the richer because we are listening to each other; and then all together listening to the promptings of the Holy Spirit. It is in these spaces of talking and listening that the creative transformative spirit in us is birthed.

As missionary disciples, we are called to have a transforming encounter with Jesus, experiencing his love. In a changing and evolving world, all of us are invited to be creative and responsive to contextual needs.

In preparation for the 19<sup>th</sup> General Chapter, the Guide for Communal Reflection says, "We are in the world increasingly marked by woundedness and fragmentation due to violence, religious fundamentalism, violation of human rights, etc.". Do we actually listen to the voice of the underprivileged and oppressed? Can we listen to indigenous peoples, the tribal people, and the cultures that have lost their voice? Are we going to grow as God's people by being more alert, accepting, and fair?

There is a joy in listening and walking together. But, this joy can achieve its perfection through the process of listening to the people who are at the periphery, who are marginalized, and who are pushed by us.

Jesus knew what the two disciples were discussing. But he still wanted to listen to them. He wanted to know what is happening with them, from their perspective.

As we listen to each other, and then together to the Holy Spirit, I am sure we will be able to understand the needs of our times.

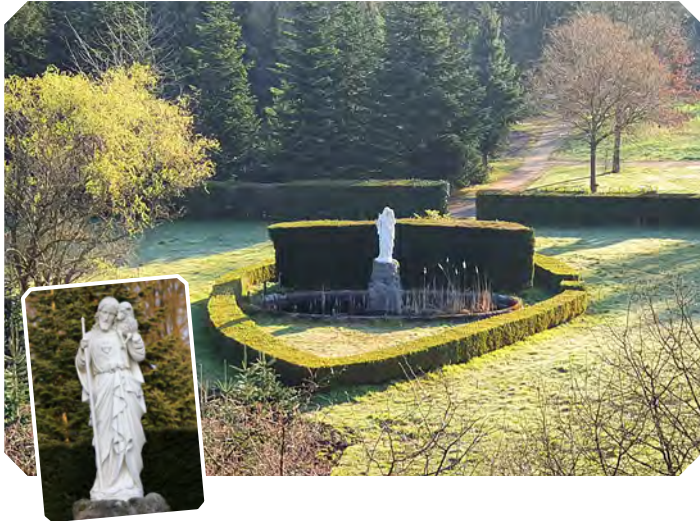

## A Visit to Steyl

### Part 3 : The Parks

To see everything in Steyl at your leisure, you need more than just a short day visit. It is no coincidence that the entire ensemble of the three mother houses of the Arnoldus religious

family is called "Monastery Village Steyl". Therefore, we also take our time on our imaginary visit. In this issue we visit the parks with the grottos and the cemetery of the SVD.



At the same time when St. Michael's was founded and built, the parks were also laid out. They were created between 1875 and 1900.

To the left of the entrance path to the small park is the figure of Christ, the Good Shepherd, in a small orchard meadow. Figures and biblical representations can be found everywhere in the parks. In the small park, next to the "Good Shepherd", there is a representation of St. Anne with Mary as a child (see cover picture), Calvary, and the figure of St. Aloysius.

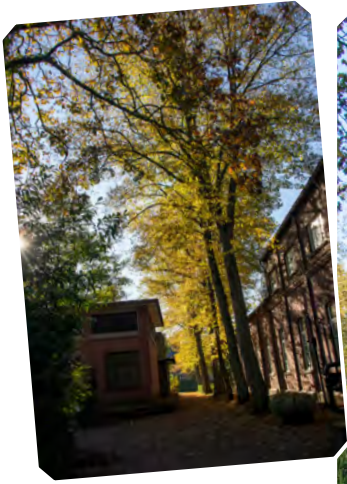
A special feature in this part of the park are the grottoes, the Grotto of the Mount of Olives, the Grotto of Mary, and the Grotto of the Seven Sorrows of Mary. The grottoes were built between 1890 and 1900. The building material was waste and slag from the brickworks of Tegelen, a neighbouring village of



Steyl.

The Marian grotto is particularly well decorated with a small Marian altar. The walls are decorated with mosaics made of pieces of coal, bricks, pebbles, and glass. The Marian altar is





In the large park, the path leads past the well house, which protects the spring from which the drinking water for the houses still comes, and the former Kes-sel House to the Hill of the Sacred Heart. The top of the hill is the highest point in the park and there is a statue of Christ, a copy of the Sacred Heart statue from Montmartre in Paris.



The path continues to the Lourdes Grotto, built in 1922 by soldiers who had recovered in Steyl from wounds received in the First World War.



Further into the park, hidden above the path, is a small bower where Arnold Janssen liked to stay to enjoy the peace and quiet of the park.





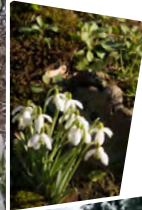
Also in the large park is the SVD cemetery. It is bordered by a wall with a Stations of the Cross. From the entrance gate, a straight path leads to an elevated chapel, the original burial place of Arnold Janssen. He was buried there until his beatification in 1975.

To the right and left of the chapel are the graves of some SVD bishops and in a semicircle in front of the chapel, those of the General Superiors.



The back wall of the chapel is decorated with a mosaic of the Risen Christ. The mosaic stones come from all the countries where the Arnoldus family is active.

The parks are places of rest and recreation and beautiful in all seasons.



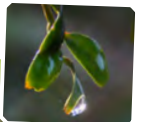
In winter with snow and the first flowers of the year, the snowdrops.

On 14<sup>th</sup> May 2022, the Mater Dei Pastoral Centre, Diocese of Polokwane organized a Reunion of Bible Graduates from 2010-2021. Many SVD lay partners in Polokwane Diocese are Alumni of the Mater Dei Bible Course. Divine Word Missionaries came to Polokwane Diocese in 2007. In 2008, Fr. Sunny John the Director of the Centre, introduced Bible Study Course for the laity, faithfully carrying out the charism and the vision of our Founder, St. Arnold Janssen. SVDs were new to the people in our Diocese but by attending this Bible Course on weekends, we came to know more about the Divine Word Missionaries and their charism. Fr. Sunny, Mission Secretary of Botswana Province from 2009 to 2019, introduced SVD lay partners in our Diocese. Sunny at the Pastoral Centre in the administration and also taking Bible classes.

## Angola (ANG): Associação de Leigos Missionários do Verbo Divino

### The Role of Lay Partners and the SVD Mission in the Light of the 18<sup>th</sup> General Chapter



The first meeting of SVD lay partners with their Provincial Superior was held on 7<sup>th</sup> May 2022, in the auditorium of the Missionary School of Christ the King parish. This meeting was organized by Fr. Denis Pereira and the lay partners with a theme: "The Love of Christ impels us (2 Cor 5:14): Rooted in the Word, Committed to his Mission". In light of the 18<sup>th</sup> General Chapter, the role of lay partners in the SVD Mission was discussed. It was moderated by Fr. João Ladeira. The meeting was attended by forty-three participants from different parishes and the lay partners from Christ the King, Divine Word, and St. Magdalene parishes.

The facilitator, Fr. Daniel Malamba, the Provincial Superior, explained that the role of the laity is not to be the helper of priests or to raise funds for missions. Lay partners are called to be active members and missionaries in the communities, to work for the good of the society, to know how to communicate, to read the Bible, to animate and respect the environment, to fight for the good of all people through justice, peace and integrity of creation. Fr. Malamba also insisted that "the success of the mission lies in dialogue and acceptance of the condition of the laity". The Provincial promised the groups that there would be greater support for the SVD lay partners and that their statutes would soon be approved.

On 8<sup>th</sup> May, the SVD lay partner group from St. Magdalene parish celebrated their 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary with the sharing of some of their experiences of mission, their determination, the



initiatives undertaken, and the challenges they have overcome over the years. The celebration was graced by Frs. Malamba, Ladeira, and Pereira.

On 29<sup>th</sup> May, the group visited some bedridden elderly sick people with some basic needy items to them as a sign of fraternal love and care for them.

## Zambia (ZAM): Friends of the Novitiate

### First Meeting of the Group – An Initiative from Fr. George Clement Angmor, Novice Master, Zambia



In the observation of the Zambia Mission since his arrival almost a year ago, Fr. George Clement Angmor, the Novice Master began taking several initiatives both in the novitiate community and the mission at large. The recent of these is the organization of the Friends of the Novitiate (FoN) which would be inaugurated into the SVD lay partners (SVDLP) in Kabwe, Zambia. This is the first in the diocese and second in the Zambia mission, following the premier group in the Holy Family Parish of Linda, Lusaka, established by Fr. Lawrence Likulano, Parish Priest, and also, the Mission Secretary.

The first meeting took place on Saturday, 21<sup>st</sup> May 2022, at the Divine Word Novitiate at Dallas, a suburb of Kabwe. Twelve people attended the program. Fr. Appiah Samuel started with a presentation on “Who are the Divine Word Missionaries?” followed by Nyabwari Ombuna Cosmas, on “Who are the SVD Lay Partners?” and “What is the novitiate?” by Matiwaza Hanani. Some video clips from SVD lay partners around the world were shown to give members a better idea of what SVD lay partners are doing and where they might start.

Fr. George announced that the group would be inaugurated on 17<sup>th</sup> July, the day of the profession of first vows of the novices. He also informed members about the upcoming meeting of the AFRAM SVD lay partners in Congo and encouraged them to attend. He introduced the websites of the SVD, SSpS, SSpSAP, and the Lay Partners, to know more about the Arnoldus Family.

In addition, Fr. George also read the message from the SVD Generalate Mission Secretary, Fr. Stanislaus Lazar. He reminded them of the fact that like every baptized person, we are called to be missionary disciples, and by becoming SVD lay partners, they are being called to collaborate with the SVD as partners in mission, learning, and sharing in the Arnoldus Spirituality, promising that they would be enriched by becoming part of the Arnoldus Family, much as we are also enriched.

Out of those present for this first meeting, four were nominated as interim executives. They are from different parishes:

It was a worthwhile initiative to pursue. The program concluded with Vespers and a communal supper, as well as some entertainment.

**Australia (AUS): SVD Lay Partners**

**Response to the Floods in Australia**



After the devastating floods in the Northern Rivers in far North, New South Wales, the Divine Word Missionaries' lay apostolate decided they would like to supply the much-needed Manchester\* to the people who lost their homes in Lismore. Michael Hill offered to take the goods with him when he travelled by train to the Lismore area. On 3 May 2022, he travelled by train for 11 hours to Casino Railway Station where

he was picked up by his son and drove to Lillian Rock where Mark and Helen Hill live on a small two-acre property.

He says, "While staying at Lillian Rock, we visited Lismore to observe the devastation of the City by the floods, and we only saw three people in the whole of Lismore City. It was abandoned. While in Lismore we were told they do not need any more Manchester\*, they only need money to buy food and pay bills. We, therefore, decided to leave the goods at the Welfare Centre in Nimbin where there are over 150 homeless people who could make better use of the goods we had".



This was just one of the areas of need that the SVD lay apostolate has recently been involved in.

The SVD lay partners also helped Fr. Viet Hoang Nguyen, the Mission Secretary to prepare donation envelopes for Ukraine.

## Indonesia (IDJ): Soverdia

**Various Activities: Fundraising, Visiting Prisoners and Seniors, and Spiritual Formation.**



### An education fund for SVD candidates

Apart from being concerned about the work of the SVD Mission through the "Coin for Mission" movement, Soverdia cares for funding for the education expenses of SVD candidates. In May of last year, Soverdia Bali-Lombok hosted a Mass and a special collection to benefit the education fund to welcome the brothers from the SVD Novitiate. Likewise, Soverdia Tenggarong, East Kalimantan, carried out fundraising activities for the education of SVD candidates.

### Strengthening the management of Soverdia

In an effort to improve and develop services, it is necessary to form strong and solid management. In line with this, Soverdia West Kalimantan District and Soverdia Jakarta District have confirmed their new committee. Likewise, Soverdia, Surabaya-Malang District, has confirmed their Spiritual Director for three SVD lay partner groups in parishes that are not served by SVD.

### Holy Week celebrations at the prison and with the elderly and needy

The Good Friday Worship service, which the inmates at the Kerobokan Bali Prison have missed for the past two years due



to the pandemic, is now again being arranged by Bali-Lombok. In addition, in collaboration with the Denpasar SVD Community, it organized Holy Week Services for the elderly at the Soverdia Denpasar Chapel, and held a simple Easter celebration for them. Soverdia Jeruju West Kalimantan celebrated Easter by sharing their love in the form of distributing food packages for those in need.

### Virtual spiritual activities

In order to further develop the brotherhood among the SVD lay partner groups within the Province, virtual spiritual activities are still held once a month in Java Province. The virtual activities included Holy Mass and Lenten Recollection via Zoom and YouTube by Soverdia Bali-Lombok District, Easter Service, and Recollection via YouTube by Soverdia Jakarta District, Rosary in May via Zoom from IDJ, IDE, IDR, and, IDT, and Pentecost Novena in June via YouTube by Soverdia Surabaya-Malang District in collaboration with SVD Batu Novitiate, Malang.

#### Implementing the 18<sup>th</sup> General Chapter document

In implementing the 18<sup>th</sup> General Chapter document, Co-responsibility with SVD Lay Partners in Promoting the Missionary vocation, the SVD lay partners of SVD Ruteng Province together with the Mission Secretary visited a few SVD parishes at Rekas, Redong, and Golo Dukal Parishes. SVD lay partners were introduced and activities like mission animation and fundraising were carried out in the parishes.

#### Visit to SVD parishes – awareness and fundraising



Rekas Parish was the third mission station of SVD established in 1924 and established as a Parish in 1926. The first parish priest was the late Fr. Frans Eickmann, SVD. On the 12<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup> of February, we visited the parish and held mission

animation programs for the parishioners. We distributed mission envelopes to receive donations for SVD worldwide mission. After the Mass, we met with some parishioners and introduced them to SVD lay partners. A week later, we visited Redong parish and in March we went to St. Nikolaus Golo

Dukal parish. We carried out similar mission activities in all the parishes. People were very generous. Some showed interest to join the SVD lay partner group. After our visits, we realized that people are praying for the SVDs and have a generous heart to contribute to the SVD missions, even though some of them are very poor.

On the 26<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup> of March, we visited Elar parish. This visit was very challenging because of the very bad road conditions. On our way, we stopped at Mombok parish where two of our confreres work. At Elar parish, we took part in the Mass and spoke to the parishioners about our missionary activities. Here too many showed interest in joining the lay partner group. Parish priest, Fr. Lorens Kuil, promised to establish the SVD lay partner group and support it.

Despite being extremely exhausting, we discovered that missionaries must be ready to face challenges. Poor road conditions should not discourage us from carrying out our mission. Therefore, they must have in themselves the spirit of total self-giving no matter what the situation is.

We were delighted by the music played by members of the blind community throughout the group activities. Some of them sang songs for us and entertained us.

## India (ING)

Around 40 leaders and their parish priests participated in this two-day seminar organized by ING. It was an enriching experience program led by Sr. Anchal, CHF and Sr. Siny Jose, CHF on the first day and Susan Noronha, an active SVD Lay Partner from Mumbai, on the second day.

Regional Superior, Fr. Maxim Rodrigues and Mission Secretary, Fr. Clement Quadras, were actively involved in the seminar. The two-day sessions were filled with many activities; sharing, group activities, etc. There was much eagerness in the lay leaders to know one another and their involvement in the missions.

On the Solemnity of the Annunciation, being the Titular feast of the Society, Archbishop John Moolachira, Archbishop of Guwahati, presided over the Eucharist, encouraging the participants to be faithful followers of the Word. Fr. Francis Fernandes, AJS coordinator, spoke about our Founder, St. Arnold Janssen, St. Joseph Freinademetz, and founding generations.

ING is interwoven with mighty rivers and mysterious mountains. Diverse ethnocultural groups inhabit the Region. Through an empowerment process of education, dialogue, and networking with Government/NGOs, the SVDs are trying to educate the tribal children. They are first-generation learners. The schools not only provide knowledge but build bridges across tribes, creating platforms to live in harmony. Furthermore, the indigenous peoples are playing a crucial role in evangelizing the region.

The pioneering missionaries of the ING, Fr. Cyprian Pinto, Fr. Ivan D'Silva, Fr. Valentine Dung Dung, and Fr. Jose K, shared the SVD presence and their first experiences and challenges in ING. Susan explained how laypeople could support and get involved with the SVDs in their missions. The animation program ended with a happy note saying all will give their best and collaborate with the SVDs in carrying out the mission of Christ.

## The Philippines (PHC): The Lay Society of St. Arnold Janssen (LSSAJ)

### Politics and the Commitment to the Marginalized



The year 2022 may be considered the most controversial national election in the Philippines. Ferdinand “Bongbong” Romualdez Marcos and Sara Duterte Carpio won the presidency and vice presidency, becoming the first presidential vice-presidential ticket candidates to be elected by a majority since the establishment of the Fifth Republic in 1986, and the first presidential ticket to win together since 2004.

There were various viewpoints on the elections, including “this election was good versus evil campaign”, “the election was marked with a systemic disinformation, fake news, lies.”, “This is a seeming triumph of untruth and injustice”, and also, “Motivated by my love for the Creator, for the people, and for the land, I’m committed and prompted to continue advocating and practicing the two paradoxical twins energizing peace and reconciliation: truth-and-love, justice-and-mercy” (LS).

But the poll watchdog, church-based Parish Pastoral Council for Responsible Voting (PPCRV) already dismissed insinuations of fraud and vouched for the accuracy of election results through its manual audit. No less than the Supreme Court made its final decision, concurring with COMELEC (Commission on Elections) on the result of the election.

LSSAJ too recommended a course of action. Summing up the seven-page statement: Join PPCRV as a volunteer and be an influencer thereby being a critical, thoughtful, hardworking, and helpful person; Know Your Candidate; cleanse your mind



of all vestiges of a herd mentality for you are not cattle but thinking persons of dignity; we should not be caught off-guard but be ready to be critical participants; pray incessantly and be the spiritual warriors during the coming election.

### Strengthening Peasants Organizations’ Rights

Inspired by Pope Francis’s challenge of “encountering Jesus in the periphery”, Charlie Avila, Chairman of LSSAJ, and Mayette Tamondong, Corporate Secretary, travelled the rugged muddy swamps, to meet the peasants’ group and the officers of the City Government’s Cooperative on 7<sup>th</sup> July in San Jose del Monte, Bulacan to evaluate the project called “Strengthening peasants organizations’ rights to Land and Enterprises Attained for Development”. This is just the initial meeting. More to come in the next few months as LSSAJ continues on its mission to work with God’s people.

With the strong purpose of publicizing the activities carried out from Spain in favour of the *Centro Integral de Niños y Niñas de la Calle* (CINCA), El Alto, La Paz-Bolivia, Alba ONGD Association has decided to show its traveling photographic exhibition in Alcorcón and Leganés. It consists of two different exhibitions, one composed of 24 photographs taken by ALBA staff during their visits to the Bolivian capital, where the project has been developed since 1992. #### Welcome, Fr. Gino Jiménez Huésped

We wish to share with you that on 30 June 2022, our missionary community had its first meeting with the person who will accompany us from now on in this beautiful missionary journey. It is our Spiritual Advisor Fr. Gino Jiménez Huésped. We are deeply grateful for the kindness, availability, and missionary commitment of Fr. Gino, who accepted to accompany us on our journey as a community. His presence and missionary experience will be a great contribution to us.

Together we will face the great challenges we face today and ways of doing mission in these times, pandemic included. With Fr. Gino we continue on this Synodal journey because our Church and Congregation are the responsibility of all: laity and consecrated.

We are grateful to our Provincial, Fr. Yuventus Kota for making it possible for one of his confreres to accompany us and to Fr. Gino for accepting this new task.

#### We Tripantu - Indigenous New Year

This year, I was invited to participate in *We Tripantu*, the indigenous New Year, by a *lamngen* (sister) of Alma Verbita who participates in her Mapuche organization of Lelfunche. *We tripantu*, also called *Wiñol Tripantu*, means in *Mapudungun*

(Mapuche language), “new year” or “return of the sun”. On this day our Mapuche people celebrate a religious ceremony in which they pray and give thanks for the new year. It is celebrated together with family and friends at the *rehue* (ceremonial Altar), sharing meals, *mate\**, hugs, conversations, and greetings.

The Chilean Government has declared 21<sup>st</sup> June as a holiday, to give an enhancement to this ceremony, which begins on the winter solstice, the day when the sun is farthest from the earth, where the day is the shortest and the night is the longest. The indigenous communities gather on this day and begin the celebration with the sunrise to make *llellipun* (prayer) and renew the *nehuen* (strength), *kimun* (knowledge), and *mongen* (health). In this celebration the Mapuche are invited by *ngenechen* (God) and by the *Nuke Mapu* (mother earth), praying to the four corners of the earth, thanking for the year that is gone, and asking for the new year that is beginning.

Alma Verbita warmly greets our Mapuche brothers and sisters and wishes them a very Happy New Year.

## Generalate Visitation CAM

### Experience with SVD Lay Partners' Group in CAM

During the general visitation to the Central American Region (CAM) from 19 March to 10 April 2022, I had an opportunity to meet the SVD lay partners' group in Alcalde Diaz, in the suburbs of Panama City. There are two SVD parishes with almost 40 years of history that gave origin to the formation of the SVD lay partners. Some twenty persons participated in the meeting, enriched by a cultural presentation from their side, but I was told, there are more of them belonging to the group. The recent pandemic had influenced their meetings and involvement.

From what they shared, I learned that presently they are the only organized group of SVD lay partners in CAM. Up to some years ago, there was also an active group in Upala, Costa Rica, but, unfortunately, due to the transfer of SVDs from that place, and does not continue anymore. Members of the group in Alcalde Diaz organize mission outreach programs in other parts of Panama. I was told, for example, that they were more times for a couple of days in Chiriquí Grande on the Atlantic coast when SVDs were in charge of the parish. And as I was concluding the visitation of CAM, two very active members of

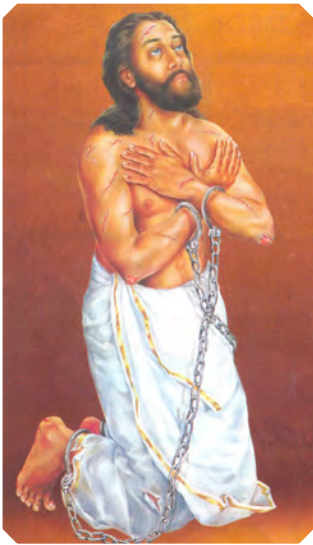
the group, Rogelio and his wife Ruby, were preparing themselves to spend the approaching Easter week on the islands of Otoque that SVD started to attend quite recently and where the pastoral work was neglected in the past years.

SVD lay partners' group in CAM has taken so far nice initiatives in support of the mission in the Region. However, it faces the challenge to recompact itself after the restrictions linked to the pandemic of COVID-19 and, mainly, to assist the creation of other groups in the eastern part of Panama (like in David), but also in Costa Rica and, possibly, in Nicaragua – the countries that belong to CAM.

## Unkown Saints: India

### Devasahayam - The First Indian Layman Declared a Saint by Pope Francis



Pope Francis canonized Blessed Devasahayam during a Canonisation Mass in St Peter's Basilica on 15<sup>th</sup> May 2022. Devasahayam, who embraced Christianity in the 18<sup>th</sup> century, became the first Indian layman to be declared a saint by Pope.

“To many of us who have received the faith from our forebears, Devasahayam's testimony reminds us that the Gospel is a treasure to be discovered and to which devote a lifetime [...] The canonization is an encouragement to us to emulate Devasahayam.” said Archbishop Felix Machado of Vasai Diocese, Secretary-

General of the Catholic Bishops' Conference of India (CBCI).

Christian name 'Lazarus', which translates 'God is my help.' When Devasahayam was struggling with sadness over difficulties in his family, the officer first introduced him to the Old Testament story of Job and, over time, to Christianity as a whole. Though conversion was illegal, Devasahayam soon knew he wanted to give himself to Christ. The naval officer introduced him to a Jesuit priest, who prepared him for baptism.

However, Devasahayam's conversion did not go well with the heads of his native religion. His refusal to worship the Hindu gods of the palace and renouncing the traditional Hindu religious festivals greatly angered the officers. They could not tolerate his preaching on the equality of all peoples, the overcoming of castes, and friendship with the untouchables of the lower classes, which is forbidden for a person of high caste. False charges of treason and espionage were brought against him. He was imprisoned and subjected to harsh persecution. A Catholic for only seven years, he was shot dead in the Aralvaimozhy forest on 14<sup>th</sup> January 1752. Devasahayam was only 39 years old. His remains were placed near the Altar from what is now the diocesan cathedral, St. Xavier's Church, Kottar, Nagercoil, India.

#### Who is Devasahayam?

On 23<sup>rd</sup> April 1712, Devasahayam Pillai was born as Neelakandan Pillai to a Hindu Nair family in Nattalam, Kanyakumari district, India. His father was Vasudevan Namputhiri, a Brahmin, and his mother Devaki Amma of the Nair caste. Devasahayam married Bhargaviammal belonging to his own caste.

Devasahayam began his career as an official in the palace of King Marthanda Varma, King of Travancore. He was inspired by Captain Eustachius De Lannoy, a Dutch naval officer who brought him to the Catholic religion in 1745. He took the

### VI World Day of the Poor – “For your sake Christ became poor” – International Prayer Bridge
